Wedding Guide



Marrying in Massachusetts

In beginning your new life together, there are legal consideration to follow while planning your big day.

All people who marry in Massachusetts must have a marriage license issued in Massachusetts. An out-of-state marriage license cannot be used, you must follow the same protocol as a resident of the state of Massachusetts..

State law requires that both parties apply in person and jointly file marriage intentions with any city or town clerk in the Commonwealth. Town of Dennis Clerk's Office is located at 485 Main Street, South Dennis, MA 02660, telephone number 508-760-6112, fax number 508-394-8309. You can file for a license Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, the fee is \$25.00, cash or check (no credit cards).

Both applicants must be 18 years of age or older to file marriage intentions. Otherwise, a court order must be obtained. A marriage license is valid for 60 days from the date intentions are filed and may be used in any Massachusetts' city or town. There is a mandatory 3 day waiting period from the date of application to the date the license is issued. This can be waived following a hearing before a probate or district court judge when a couple can show "good reason". After the waiting period, only one person has to pick up the license.

Massachusetts statue does not require that any witnesses be present at your ceremony. It is the responsibility of the officiating clergy or justice of the peace to complete and sign the original license as well as return it to the city or town where the license was issued.

When planning your Dennis wedding on beautiful cape Cod, there are several things you should keep in mind.

The most popular months for weddings on Cape Cod are May, June, September

and October and the most requested day of the week is Saturday. Alternative days are becoming popular and will find greater availability with shorter advance planning.

Twelve to Eighteen Months Ahead

	Determine your budget and style of wedding (formal, informal, etc.) Set a date and time. Be sure to check for holidays and any local special events that may occur at that time that may affect your plans (eg. Dennis Road Race) Choose and book clergy/justice of the peace. Visit your officiate with your finance and select service type. Book ceremony site and choose reception site. Consider hiring a wedding consultant. Choose attendants and invite them to be part of your wedding party. Interview and select photographer, videographer, musicians, entertainment and/or DJ. Draw up your guest list; have your finance's family do the same. Shop for your engagement ring. For additional advice and ideas, check out the wedding section of your local bookstore and library.			
	Six to Twelve Months Ahead			
	Discuss ceremony music Plan your honeymoon. Select what the groom, best man, ushers and father will wear. Enroll with the bridal registry of your favor stores Book caterer. Choose and order your wedding gown and accessories. Shop for and choose bridesmaids' dresses. Book limousines or arrange other wedding transportation. Shop for your engagement ring. Choose florist and arrangements; ask about aisle runners. Schedule any premarital counseling. Book make-up artist for wedding day. Schedule engagement photograph. Pick out wedding rings, arrange for engraving. Discuss your ceremony together with your officiate choosing readings, music, vows and order.			
Four to Six Months Ahead				
	Order invitations, thank you cards and other printed materials (napkins, matchbooks, programs, stationery, etc.) Suggest mothers choose their dresses. Schedule rehearsal, book rehearsal dinner location. Reserve tents, rental chairs, tables and linens, other rental equipment. Order wedding cake. Schedule dance lessons. Shop for your trousseau. Make accommodation arrangements for out of town attendants & family. Finalize ceremony details, ask family and friends to do readings, sing or take part in other ways.			
	Firm up menu for the reception and all details 2-4 months ahead. Look into suggestions for out-of-town wedding guest accommodations.			

One to Two Months Ahead

	Apply for marriage license, valid for 60 days in Massachusetts. Reconfirm rehearsal with ceremony site. Address and mail invitations (6-8 weeks ahead), include maps. Purchase guest book. Have final fittings for bride, groom and attendants. Have formal portrait taken. At the same time have a copy made for newspaper announcement insertion. Finalize honeymoon plans. Choose wedding gifts for each other Make beauty appointments. Pick up wedding rings. Record each gift as received and write a thank you note promptly. Shop for going away outfits. Finalize reception song list and agenda with your entertainment. Finalize types of photos and picture locations with your photographer. Keep track of RSVP's.			
	Two to Four Weeks Ahead			
	Make sure you have your marriage license. Pick up your gown and accessories. Reconfirm arrangements with all ceremony and reception service vendors. Draw up seating plans for the ceremony and reception. Write out place cards. Try on headpiece with wedding hairstyle. Decide who will be in the receiving line. Address wedding announcements. Choose a guest book attendant. Finalize the guest list and call any guests who have not responded.			
	One to Two Weeks Ahead			
	Give final count and seating arrangements to caterer. Arrange for travelers checks and pick up honeymoon tickets. Start packing! Give bridesmaids' party or luncheon. Keep up with thank you notes. Confirm rehearsal plans with clergy/justice of the peace and attendants. Give gifts to attendants. Assign wedding day duties to attendants, family and friends. Break in your wedding shoes. Organize checks for any services to be paid on the wedding day. Pick up men's formal wear. Make sure all pieces are included & fit.			
The Day Before				
	Rehearse ceremony with attendants and family members. Attend rehearsal dinner. Update seating chart. Reconfirm wedding transportation. Mail wedding announcements.			
	Your Wedding Day			
	Have hair, nails and make up done. Bring wedding rings and marriage license. Be dressed early for pre-ceremony photographs. Try to be on time.

Tipping: Most gratuities will be included in the fees, but it is customary to tip some of the following professionals who helped to make your day special. The following is a list for proper tipping protocol: Clergy Member -- usually a \$10 and up donation, Limousine, D.J., Photographer -- 15%, Waiters, Waitresses -- 15%, Captains -- 1 to 2% and Maitre D' -- 15%.
